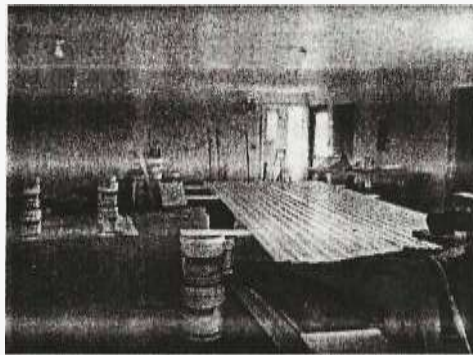


Hanley's Senior Complex

Students For Hire

The students of the 2010 Culture Club have been busy deciding on a trip location and an educational travel company. This year we have decided to go with a different travel company. The new agency we have decided on is EF tours, they have been in business for the past 40 years and, having talked with other schools that have traveled with them, they are an excellent alternative.

The students have decided on a 9 day trip to Costa Rica. This location was chosen for a number of reasons. The main reason is that it is less costly. Due to the rising cost of fuel in the past the prices of trips have been on an incline and unfortunately have not come down with the economy decline.

Costa Rica will provide the students with a wide range of educational experiences. They will start the trip with a biological diversity tour at the National Institute of Biodiversity then onto a walk through three different ecosystem trails exploring different plant life. They will have the opportunity to explore a volcano with its many sulphurous lakes. The group will have the chance to see first hand, coffee producers at work, then off to the jungles and rainforests. Here the students will see where a group of Alabama Quakers settled and started dairy farming. One of the many stops will be to visit a school to have a homemade lunch and interact with the students of the school. At the end of another day each student will plant a tree at a reserve for the production of oxygen for future generations. The last night all travelers are treated to a traditional meal with marimba music and local dancers.

We recognize that the community has been very generous in the past years with supporting the culture club and we are very thankful for all your help. This year we will not be going door to door asking for support. We feel though that the students have become valued as a service provider and we will be continuing with that in the form of being available for farm auctions, weddings, working the booth at our curling and hockey rinks and other duties as required. In the past, the main source of money raised for trips was made through bingos, however, due to the recent changes of policies, these are not a viable option for the group at this time. Please donate your gently used items for this fundraising event. We welcome; antiques, coins, used running vehicles, household goods, toys, sports equipment and electronics, just to name a few.

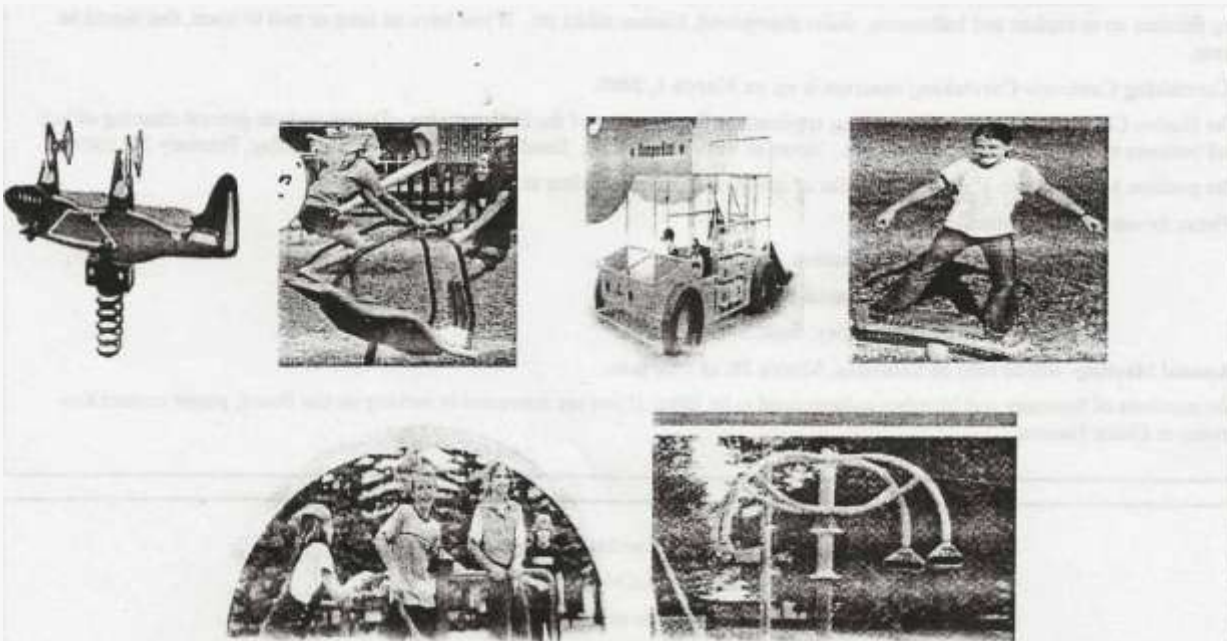
Please ensure all items are clean and in good working order, no mattresses or soiled furniture will be accepted.
